Cross-Complainant INDIAN WELLS VALLEY WATER DISTRICT ("District") alleges as follows:

## Introduction

1. This Cross-Complaint requests that the Court conduct a comprehensive adjudication pursuant to Title 10, Chapter 7 of the Code of Civil Procedure (sections 830 et seq.), in which the Court would determine all rights to extract (aka pump) groundwater in the Indian Wells Valley Groundwater Basin No. 6-54 ("Basin"), whether based on appropriation, overlying right, or other basis of right, and all rights to use of storage space in the Basin; enter judgment based upon the criteria set forth in section 850 of the Code of Civil Procedure; and impose a physical solution pursuant to section 849 of the Code of Civil Procedure ("Comprehensive Adjudication").
2. The Comprehensive Adjudication is necessary to protect the limited water supply that is vital to the public health, safety, and welfare of all persons and entities that depend upon waters from the Basin; to ensure its reasonable use pursuant to Article X , section 2 of the California Constitution; and to sustainably manage the Basin pursuant to the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (Water Code sections 10720-10737.8) ("SGMA").

## Jurisdiction and Venue

3. This Court has subject matter jurisdiction to comprehensively adjudicate rights to extract groundwater in the Basin and use the Basin's storage space, and to impose a physical solution in this action pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure section 834.
4. Pursuant to section 838 of the Code of Civil Procedure, any judge of the Superior Court of California, County of Kern, County of Inyo, and County of San Bernardino is disqualified because Kern County, Inyo County, and San Bernardino County overlie the Basin.
5. Pursuant to section 838 of the Code of Civil Procedure, this Comprehensive Adjudication is presumed to be a complex action under Rule 3.400 of the Califormia Rules of Court.
6. Pursuant to section 838 of the Code of Civil Procedure, sections 170.6 and 394 of the Code of Civil Procedure do not apply to this Comprehensive Adjudication.

## Parties

7. The District is a county water district formed pursuant to Water Code section 30000 et seq. and a public agency of the State of California located in the County of Kern. The District operates wells that extract groundwater from the Basin and provides water services to the residents of the City of Ridgecrest and surrounding communities. Pursuant to Water Code sections 106 and 106.5, the District has a prior and paramount right to Basin water as against all non-municipal uses.
8. Defendants named herein as All Persons Who Claim a Right to Extract Groundwater in the Indian Wells Valley Groundwater Basin No. 6-54 Whether Based on Appropriation, Overlying Right, or Other Basis of Right, and/or Who Claim a Right to Use of Storage Space in the Basin are all persons or entities who claim a right to extract groundwater in the Basin whether based on appropriation, overlying right, or other basis or right and/or who claim a right to use storage space within the Basin.
9. The District is informed and believes that the following named defendants own an interest in one or more parcels in the Basin, and/or extract or store water in the Basin, and/or claim rights or interests in the Basin:

13. The District is informed and believes that the United States of America ("United States") claims rights to the Basin water subject to adjudication in this action by virtue of owning real property overlying the Basin, including Naval Air Weapons Station China Lake ("NAWS China Lake") and lands managed by the United States Bureau of Land Management ("BLM") and United States Forest Service ("FS"). The District is also informed and believes that the United States claims rights to the Basin under Federal Laws and pursuant to the Federal Reserved Water Rights Doctrine. (Cappaert v. United States, 426 U.S. 128 (1976).) For reasons explained in this cross-complaint, the United States is a necessary party to this action pursuant to the McCarran Amendment, 43 U.S.C. section 666. Under the McCarran Amendment, the United States, as a necessary party to this action, is deemed to have waived any right to plead that the laws of California are not applicable, or that the United States is not subject to such laws by virtue of its sovereignty. Under the McCarran Amendment, the United States, as a necessary party to this action, is subject to the judgments, orders, and decrees of this Court. The District is informed and believes that under the McCarran Amendment, the United States is not susceptible to costs in this suit.
14. The District is informed and believes that Cross-Defendants Roes 1 through 100,000 are the owners, lessees, or other persons or entities (a) holding or claiming to hold ownership or possessory interests in real property overlying the Basin; (b) extracting water from the Basin; (c) claiming some right, title, or interest to water located within the Basin; and/or (d) having or claiming the right to extract and/or store groundwater in the Basin.
15. The District is unaware of the true names and capacities of Cross-Defendants Roes 1 through 100,000 . When the District becomes aware of their true names and capacities, it will seek leave of court to amend this Cross-Complaint accordingly.

## Notice of Comprehensive Adjudication

13. Pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure section 836, the District lodged with the Court a draft Notice entitled "NOTICE OF COMMENCEMENT OF GROUNDWATER BASIN ADJUDICATION" and draft Form Answer entitled "ANSWER TO ADJUDICATION CROSS-COMPLAINT." Copies of the draft Notice and draft Form Answer are available at https://www.iwvwd.com/.
14. Within 30 days of filing this Cross-Complaint, the District will file a motion for approval of the draft Notice and draft Form Answer.
15. The District will also seek Court approval for service of the approved Notice and Form Answer in accordance with section 836 of the Code of Civil Procedure as a substitute for the summons otherwise provided for in Civil Actions pursuant to section 412.20 of the Code of Civil Procedure.
16. Following a court order approving the Notice and Form Answer and authorizing service of the landowners pursuant to section 836 (d)(1), the District will identify the assessor parcel numbers and physical addresses of all real property in the Basin and the names and addresses of all holders of fee title to real property in the Basin using the records of the assessors of Kern, Inyo, and San Bernardino counties ("Overlying Landowners") and complete service of the Overlying Landowners as required by the Court.
17. Pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure section $836(\mathrm{k})$, upon receipt of the requisite notice, Overlying Landowners interested in this proceeding shall have the duty to appear in this action and submit proof of their claims, if any.

## General Allegations

18. The District is informed and believes overdraft conditions have existed in the Basin for decades as a result of groundwater pumping. The Basin is located in the northwestern part of the Mojave Desert in Southern California and underlies approximately 382,000 acres or approximately 600 square miles of land. Approximately 301,000 acres of land overlying the Basin are federal property managed by NAWS China Lake, BLM and FS. The non-federal lands overlying the Basin consist of the City of Ridgecrest and unincorporated land in the Counties of Kern, Inyo, and San Bernardino. The Basin is bordered on the west by the Sierra Nevada Mountain Range, on the north by the Coso Range, on the east by the Argus Range, and on the south by the El Paso Mountains. Surface water flow from the surrounding mountain ranges drains to China Lake, a large dry lake located in the central northeast part of the Basin. U.S. Route 395 and State Route 14 are the major vehicular arteries through the Basin. A true and correct copy of a map of the Basin is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated by reference as if set forth in full.
19. In 2014, the State of California adopted SGMA " $[t]$ o provide for the sustainable management of groundwater basins," and "[t]o provide a more efficient and cost-effective groundwater adjudication process that protects water rights, ensures due process, prevents unnecessary delay, and furthers the objectives" of sustainable groundwater management. The Basin which is the subject of this cross-complaint was designated by the California Department of Water Resources ('DWR") as high priority and critically overdrafted under SGMA. As such, the associated groundwater sustainability agency was required to submit a groundwater sustainability plan by January 31, 2020.
20. The Indian Wells Valley Groundwater Authority ("Authority") Board of Directors adopted Resolution 02-16 on December 8, 2016 to establish itself as the groundwater
sustainability agency for the Basin. Thereafter, on January 16, 2020, the Authority adopted Resolution 01-20, a resolution adopting a groundwater sustainability plan ("Plan") for the Basin.
21. The Plan does not change or alter existing water rights. Water Code section 10720.5(b) specifically provides that nothing in SGMA "determines or alters surface water rights or groundwater rights under common law or any provision of law...." Similarly, pursuant to Water Code section 10720.3, any claimed Federal Reserved Water Right is beyond the jurisdiction of the Authority to regulate under the Plan.
22. This cross-complaint seeks a judicial determination of rights to all water within the Basin. A comprehensive adjudication is necessary to protect and conserve the limited water supply that is vital to the public health, safety, and welfare of all persons and entities in the Basin. The District brings this action to protect the general welfare of the Basin; protect the District's right to pump groundwater and provide water to the public; prevent degradation of the quality of the groundwater supply; stop land subsidence; and avoid higher water costs to the public. The District is informed and believes that only a comprehensive adjudication and order of the Court comprehensively determining all rights to extract groundwater will be sufficient to protect the District's water supplies and bring viable sustainability to the Basin.
23. Any judgment and physical solution in this proceeding approved by the Court will be submitted to DWR for review and approval pursuant to Water Code sections 10733.6 and 10737.4

## FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION

(Code Civ. Proc. §§ 830-852 - Comprehensive Adjudication and Physical Solution - Against All Cross-Defendants)
24. The District incorporates by reference the allegations of paragraphs 1 through 23.
25. The Basin has been, and presently is, in a condition of long-term overdraft for a period of longer than ten years consistent with Code of Civil Procedure sections 832(d) and 847(a).
26. There is presently no viable means to cure the Basin's overdraft through artificial recharge or other supply augmentation strategy under current Basin conditions and cumulative average annual extraction/pumping quantities.
27. The District has the right to utilize water from the Basin to meet existing public water needs and also to utilize increased amounts of water from the Basin as may be necessary to meet future public needs. The District's rights to the Basin's water exist both as a result of the priority and extent of its appropriative and prescriptive rights.
28. Disputes have arisen regarding the parties' respective rights to extract groundwater from the Basin. This action is necessary to comprehensively determine and adjudicate all groundwater rights in the Basin and provide a physical solution for continuous and long-term management of the Basin, consistent with the reasonable and beneficial use doctrine under Article X, section 2 of the California Constitution.
29. Pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure section 849 , the court has the authority and duty to impose a physical solution on the parties to a comprehensive adjudication where necessary and consistent with Article X , section 2 of the California Constitution. A physical solution is a common-sense approach to resolving water rights litigation that seeks to satisfy the reasonable and beneficial needs of parties through various practical measures. Pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure section 852, this Court must determine, impose, and retain continuing jurisdiction to enforce a physical solution upon the parties who pump water from the Basin, and therefore prevent irreparable injury and undesirable results to the Basin.
30. Pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure section 847, and upon a showing the Basin is in a condition of long-term overdraft, the Court may impose a preliminary injunction which may include, (a) a moratorium on new or increased appropriations from the Basin, (b) a limitation on, or reduction in, the extraction of water from the Basin, (c) an allocation among the parties establishing amounts of extraction allowed from the Basin during the pendency of this comprehensive adjudication, and (d) procedures for voluntary transfers of water.
31. The Basin is in a condition of long-term overdraft. The District seeks issuance of a preliminary injunction pursuant to, among other things, Code of Civil Procedure section 847.

## Prayer for Relief

WHEREFORE, the District prays for the following relief:

1. For a judgment to comprehensively determine and adjudicate all groundwater rights in the Basin and provide a physical solution for the perpetual and continuous management of the Basin pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure section 850;
2. For a preliminary injunction to provide for the management of the Basin, on an interlocutory basis, through entry of final judgment and any appeal;
3. For entry of judgment against all cross-defendants who fail to appear in this action that they be bound by any judgment and physical solution, and their storage rights in the Basin, if any, be limited to the terms of the judgment;
4. For a judgment against all persons who, presently or in the future, own an interest in real property overlying the Basin and who fail to appear in this action that they are bound by the judgment and physical solution, and their water rights, if any, are limited to the terms of the judgment; and
5. For such other and further relief as the Court deems just and proper.
